1. Describe the latest hobby, possession or activity in which you have become interested. Why does it give you so much pleasure?
2. Is it better to have comfort or excitement in life? Give reasons and examples to support your view.
3. Write a story which includes the sentence: ' I was surrounded by important people, but no-one that I knew'.
4. Write a story in which your first impression of someone or something prove to be misleading.(Remember that you should include full details of your first impressions, to show how wrong you were.)
5. Describe a time when you prefer to be alone and a time when you like to be part of a crowd. (Remember that you are describing the atmosphere and your feelings, not telling a story.)
6. What are the advantages and disadvantages of attending either a small school with few students or a large school with many students?
7. Write a story about someone who returned to a village or town after a long time away. (You should include full details of why the person went away to show that it is an important part of your story.)__
8. Write a story which includes the sentence: 'As we entered the building, the other people smiled as if they knew something we did not.'
9. Recently you witnessed a major disturbance at a railway station when many people were injured. You are asked by the local police to write an account of what you saw.

Write your account. You must include the following:

- When and where the incident happened and how close you were to the scene.
- The cause of the disturbance and what exactly happened.

- Some of the ways in which people tried to help.

Cover all three points above in detail. You should make your account informative and helpful for the police to show you are a reliable witness. Start your account 'To the police....' And remember to add your signature and the date.

10. You have decided to write a letter to the local newspaper about the problems of traffic in your area.

Write your letter. You must include the following:

- Details of the traffic problems (such as names of specific location, times of day, types of vehicles and other relevant details) so that the editor and the readers will know what you are concerned about.
- What should be done to solve the problem.
- What benefits would come to the community.

Cover all three points above in detail. You should make your letter informative and persuasive for the editor and the readers. Start your letter 'Dear Editor', and remember to provide a suitable ending.

11. Describe and explain some of the ways in which you have changed since you started your present school and some of the ways in which your personality remains the same. (Remember that you are describing your personality and not just telling stories about yourself.)
12. Which two ideas, customs or beliefs from a foreign country would you like to introduce into your country?
13. Write a story which includes the sentence: 'They both agreed with the decision but were not happy about it....'
14. Write a story in which love overcomes prejudice. (Remember that you should include full details of the prejudice, to show that it is an important part of your story.)

15. Your best friend, who is a popular member of your class and the captain of the sports club, is leaving your school to move overseas. On your friend's last day at school you have been asked by your teacher, Mr. Johnson, to make a speech to your classmates wishing your friend goodbye and good luck.

Write your speech. You must include the following:

- The name of your friend and where your friend is going.
- Why your friend is moving.
- What you and your classmates will miss about your friend.

Cover all three points above in detail. You should make sure your speech is friendly and contains wishes for a successful future.

Start your speech, 'Mr Johnson and friends..
